Bishop Olmsted, Dean Perkins of Pineland, N. J., and Archdeacon Schofield addressed the Auxiliary at different times during the year.

The largest number present at any one meeting was 91, at St. Luke's, Montclair.

The smallest number present at any one meeting was 22. The average attendance was 55.

Six Parishes report program meetings.

Three Parishes report Mission Study classes.

One new Branch organized at Ascension Memorial.

Two special meetings were called by the president.

On Friday, March 15th, a Quiet Day was held at St. Mark's Church, beginning with a celebration of the Holy Communion at 10 a. m., and concluding with evening prayer at 4 p. m. Bishop Olmsted conducted the services and gave a series of most helpful and inspiring addresses. About seventy-five women were present at some time during the day, many remaining for the entire period.

On February 12th, in the Chapter House of St. John's Cathedral, the Rev. Arthur Gray, Educational Secretary of the Board of Missions, addressed the Auxiliary, and on the afternoon of the three following days held a Normal Mission Study class, eight members of the Auxiliary, representing six Parishes, took the course. As a direct outcome, Mission Study Classes were organized at St. Stephen's, St. Peter's and Trinity Memorial, the "Conquest of the Continent" being used in all cases, and a permanent program committee was organized, consisting of one representative from each Denver Parish. This committee elects its own officers, a part of whose duty it is "to conduct the program at the annual meeting and regular monthly meetings of the Auxiliary." This committee, of which Mrs. H. F. Hoffman and Mrs. F. A. Ellis are chairman and first vice-chairman, presented its first program at the March meeting, and promises to do much to awaken interest and inspire enthusiasm.

The Board of Missions no longer makes a separate apportionment for General Missions to the Woman's Auxiliary and Sunday Schools, at the same time it is making a larger appropriation to Missions than it ever has done. Consequently each Diocese is asked to give a larger amount than ever before. The Board has suggested that in "every Diocesan Branch of the Auxiliary a committee from among its officers ask the Diocesan authorities what plan they mean to follow, and if and how the Auxiliary can help in carrying it out." In accordance with this suggestion, the president appointed Mrs. F. A. Ellis, Mrs. E. Le Neve Foster (both of the Cathedral), and Mrs. H. F. Hoffman of St. Stephen's, to confer with the Diocesan Board.

As an Auxiliary to the Board of Missions it is the duty and glorious privilege of each individual member to do her part in the great work the Master gave the Church on Earth to do the work of gathering all Nations into His Fold.

One hundred and fifty letters and acknowledgments have been written, one hundred and fifty-eight boxes and over seven hundred leaflets and prayer-cards have been distributed.

It seems a pity that the half-year offerings of both September, 1911, and March, 1912, should be smaller than the offering of March, 1911, the first semi-annual offering after the Cincinnati Triennial which is generally reckoned to be the least of the whole Triennium. And another pity that of the 41 organized Missions of Colorado, only ten are contributing, and of the 24 Parishes, seven are giving nothing to the United Thank-Offering of the Church.

Will not more of our Churchwomen respond to their call of service and help to realize the ideal of every Churchwoman a Churchworker, and every member have a share in the United Offering which is a work entirely for women by women, and with its service of regular prayers and systematic giving strengthens the weak places in our Auxiliary life.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE IN CONFERENCE WITH THE DIOCESAN BOARD OF DOMESTIC AND FOREIGN MISSIONS.


Owing to the fact that the Chairman and a number of members of Committee on Assessments for Domestic and Foreign Missions have been absent from the city, it was impossible to have a conference with them.

Your committee, however, finds that although the Board of Missions made an apportionment of \$9,750.00 to the Diocese of Colorado for the year ending August 31, 1912, only \$3,934.50 was apportioned by the committee among the Parishes and Missions of the Diocese, and this apportionment was made not on any pro rata expense basis, but arbitrarily in accordance with the idea of the committee as to what each Parish and Mission should contribute.

To March 1st, only \$577.82 of the amount apportioned had been contributed.

Your committee, therefore, would recommend that this matter be brought up for discussion at the annual meeting of the Auxiliary and, if deemed advisable at that time, a new committee be appointed to confer with the Committee on Domestic and Foreign Missions from the Diocesan Council so that the work of raising the Colorado apportionment may be planned for in some more systematic and effective manner than heretofore. Counsels to Parochial Officers.

Impress upon the women of your Parish that they may become, by virtue of their baptism, members of the Auxiliary. Urge them to recognize this claim by working along the appointed lines, and by giving such dues as your Parish Branch may settle upon.

Every Branch is expected to give to the United Offering, Diocesan and General Missions, and report to Diocesan Treasurer, and to do its share of the work as planned by Diocesan Officers.

After this, develop any Diocesan or general work that has the approval of your Rector, after consulting with Diocesan Officers.

The "United Offering" is the Thank-offering presented at every Triennial service of the Woman's Auxiliary. It will be given for Woman's Work in the Domestic and Foreign Fields. Every woman is given an opportunity to share in the great Thank-offering. The birthday plan for raising the United Offering has been adopted successfully in many Diocesan Branches.

Take "The Colorado Churchman" and read to your Branch the Woman's Auxiliary page. Keep ready for reference a Church Almanac with Clergy list, the last report of your Diocesan Branch, Miss Emery's last report and the Spirit of Missions; and keep in supply copies of the Auxiliary prayers, leafiets from the Church Missions House, mite chests for the United Offering, and leafiets for the Junior Auxiliary work.

When a project is laid before your Branch, do not fail to report its action, after due deliberation.

When preparing a Missionary Box, write to Diocesan Corresponding Secretary for name of recipient and information concerning his needs. Report to her when box is sent.

Remit by express, P. O. order, bank drafts or checks; never by bank notes.

Report changes of address, or temporary absence, and do not fail to notify the Corresponding Secretary when changes occur in your list of officers. Apply to the Secretaries of the various departments for further information.

The Annual Meeting is held on the Tuesday preceding the Annual Council held the first week in June.
