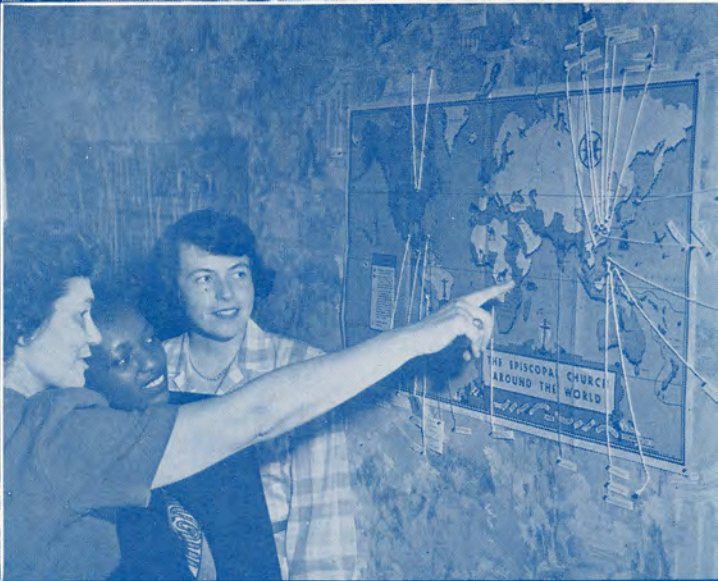




*Come to* **WINDHAM HOUSE**

*Come to* **WINDHAM HOUSE**



**W**INDHAM HOUSE is the national graduate training center for women workers of the Episcopal Church.

THE STUDENTS are college graduates who are preparing to enter professional Church work, and women already working for the Church who want to do further study.

IT IS A GRADUATE COURSE OF STUDY taking two years, including a summer and two winters of supervised field work. The academic work is taken for any graduate degree at Union Theological Seminary, Teachers' College, Columbia University or the New York School of Social Work. Also, a certificate is given by Windham House.

THE STUDY INCLUDES certain basic courses prescribed by Windham House in Bible, Church History, Theology, Ethics and Philosophy, Worship and the Prayer Book, Religious Education, Missions, etc., plus supervised practice in parishes, missions, hospitals, etc. All of this is centered in daily worship in the Chapel and in Christian living in a small, family group.
